Safety Smart Ambassador

Learning about public health, safety, and environmental stewardship is easier and more fun than ever! As a Safety Smart Ambassador, you will be sharing reassuring, clear, and confidence-building messages to help children live a better life. Safety Smart engages and excites children in fun, creative, and interactive ways, and can be presented in the classroom, at camp, scouting or youth group meetings, and even at community events – basically anywhere children are gathered. Safety Smart Ambassadors help empower children to be safety advocates...safety scientists...safety smart.

Approach

The Safety Smart guiding principle is that unintentional injuries are avoidable and preventable through Safety Smart choices. Safety Smart focuses on the causes of injury and safeguarding against the injury. For example, the Safety Smart choice of not playing with matches will avoid the start of a fire; using hand rails will avoid a fall; washing your hands will avoid the spreading of germs; and wearing a life jacket will avoid drowning. By teaching these concepts, we begin to build a consciousness and a knowledge, which children draw upon to make better lifesustaining choices.



Children ages 4 through 8 join Timon and Pumbaa as the two characters learn about being Safety Smart® in and around water. Students learn the importance of wearing sunscreen, swimming with a buddy, reading posted signs, checking water depth, and entering the water feet first. Information about treading water and water rescue are covered, as well as the dangers of swimming during a storm.

Duration	Activity	Details/Suggestions						
2 minutes	Who am I?	Introduce yourself to the children and explain how you happen to be there (e.g., your child's class, scouting group, etc.). Let the children know how to address you (e.g., Miss Jill, Mr. Smith, etc.).						
2 minutes	Why am I here?	To help the children learn about the importance of being Safety Smart when they are in and around the water. Ask the children if they know Timon and Pumbaa from <i>The Lion King</i> , and would they like to learn how they stay safe in the water?						
		Ask the children what they know about water safety and how they can stay safe in and around the water. Here are some questions to get you started: 1. Who likes to swim? Where do you swim? 2. Do you follow any rules when you swim? If so, what are they?						
8 minutes		3. Do you know what a lifeguard is?						
	What are we going to learn?	 Answer: A lifeguard is an expert swimmer who makes sure swimmers are being safe in and around the water. Lifeguards also rescue people who are having a hard time swimming in a pool or at the beach. 4. Do you think it is safe to swim during a storm? Why or why not? 5. What is sunscreen? 						
		Answer: Sunscreen is a cream or lotion rubbed into the skin to protect it from the sun.						
		 6. Do you think it is safe to swim with a buddy? 7. What does it mean to enter the water "feet first"? Answer: Entering the water "feet first" means putting your feet into the water before any other part of your body. Entering feet first will help you prevent injuries. 						
		8. Do you check the water before you enter it? Why or why not?

Duration	Activity	Details/Suggestions
12 minutes	Safety Smart®: In the Water	Gather children together to watch Timon and Pumbaa share valuable, kid-friendly lessons for staying safe in and around the water.
12 minutes	What did you learn?	Encourage discussion and participation by engaging the children about what they just learned. Here are some questions and activities to get started: 1. What did you learn? 2. What did you find most interesting? 3. How can you keep yourself safe while in and around the water? Answers: Sunscreen helps protect the skin from harmful radiation, so it is good to put on sunscreen before you go near or in the water. Read all posted signs around a pool or at the beach, because they contain important safety information. In order to prevent injuries, make sure to check the water for depth, and always enter the water feet first. Swimming with a buddy and having adult supervision are essential to water safety. Lightning and thunder are signals to leave the water immediately and to seek shelter. When swimmers need to use the bathroom, they should leave the water and find a bathroom facility. Always wear a life jacket when doing water sports. Ways to stay afloat in the water include treading water and wearing a life jacket. Learning Opportunity: It's important for children to understand that they can practice water safety behaviors before they even start swimming. To help demonstrate this concept (and to have lots of fun), engage the children in a role-playing activity. Group the children into pairs. Choose one child to play the part of Timon, and the other to play the part of Pumbaa. Encourage the children to create and perform short "skits" that present an idea they learned from the program. Here are a few situations to get them started: Timon and Pumbaa are swimming in the pool when Pumbaa hears thunder. What should the two characters do? Timon and Pumbaa are going to the beach. When they arrive, they see a sign that says "No Lifeguard on Duty." What should they do? Timon and Pumbaa are on a boat. Timon wants to dive off of the boat head first into the water. What does Pumbaa say to Timon?

		Timon & Pumbaa's Water Safety Tips (page 7)
		<i>Group:</i> arrange the children into pairs and have them work together to complete the worksheet. Once completed, review the answers together, encouraging children to explain correct answers.

		Group: have the children complete the worksheet individually or in pairs, and then project a blank worksheet on the wall. Ask children to describe what is happening in each picture and whether or not it is Safety Smart [®] .

		Look Before You Leap
	Safety Smart Activities	Ask students what the phrase "look before you leap" means. Make sure they understand that it means checking that the water is deep enough and clear of objects or people before jumping in. Work with the class to make up a song about looking before you leap. For example, you could make up a song to the tune of "Row, Row, Row Your Boat":

		Water Safety Board Game (page 9)
		Group: divide the students into pairs. Make copies of the game board and laminate them, if desired. Each pair will need a copy of the game board, two game pieces (such as math manipulatives), and a number cube. Directions for playing are on the game board.

		Individual: project a copy of the worksheet onto a wall and review the meanings of the 8 words together. Then have the children complete the worksheets on their own. Once everyone has finished the worksheets, invite volunteers to help you locate the words in the Word Search and create sentences using the 8 words.

		Group: divide students into teams and give each team one copy of the worksheet provided. Have each team work together to design an advertisement for a new sunscreen. Afterward, have teams share their advertisements with the class. Which ads are the most persuasive? What makes them effective?

You might also recommend that children hang the coloring page in the kitchen so they remember to practice their water safety lessons before heading out to swim! Maze Craze (page 13) Individual: have the children complete the maze. (Answers: page 21) Take-Home Activities: • Timon and Pumbaa's Safety Smart® Checklist (page 14)
		• Describe a Picture (page 15)
10 minutes	Sing-Along with Timon and Pumbaa	Help the children remember the ways they can stay safe in and around the water by leading them in a sing-along. (page 16) On the DVD scene selection menu, choose the Sing-Along option. Encourage the children to sing along with the characters. If the children are studying another language, you may want to consider replaying the Sing-Along in the language they are studying by re-accessing the 12-minute animation.

2 minutes	Thank you and goodbyes	Encourage the children to get "wild about safety" and start sharing the Safety Smart® behaviors they have learned.
