• Do the children really know what to do if they receive a text or email that makes them uncomfortable? Have the entire family perform a "No Bullying Allowed" skit to reinforce the lesson that if they or their friends are bullied online, they should seek help from a trusted adult.

Materials Needed:

- 2 electronic devices that can be connected to the Internet and/or receive texts (smart phone, tablet, laptop, etc.). If there are no electronic devices available, just draw two devices on a piece of paper, cut them out, and use them as props.
- 1. Assign the following parts to three members of the family: Bully, Bully's Target, Trusted Adult.
- 2. Have the Bully act out sending a mean email or text message to the Bully's Target.
- **3.** Have the Bully's Target act out feeling uncomfortable, embarrassed, or scared about the Bully's email/message.
- 4. Have the Bully's Target show the Bully's email/message to the Trusted Adult.
- 5. Have the Trusted Adult help the Bully's Target deal with the Bully.
- **6.** Feel free to have everyone take turns playing the various roles and/or include other roles, such as friends, teachers, etc.
- **7.** Finally, have the children reflect on what they have learned from the activity. Here are some questions you might want to ask:
 - Is it ever okay to send a mean email or text message to another person?
 - What is it called when someone sends a mean email or a text message to another person?
 - What should you do if you receive an email or text message that makes you feel uncomfortable, embarrassed, or scared?



PROTECTIVE PASSWORDS

A password is a series of letters and numbers that you enter to gain access to a computer account (just like the passwords you may have on tablets, cell phones, and computer games). It's important to have a password you easily remember. But it's also important to have a strong password—that's a password that would be difficult for someone to figure out, even your closest friends! 


